INTRODUCTION

Contemporary literature, unusual places, familiar faces: this is a literary happening called the Literature Night, which, in attractive or commonly inaccessible places brings excerpts from European writers' new books, presented by well-known actors, to the general public. A unique combination of an unusual place, distinctive interpretation and literary text offers a unique cultural experience and an opportunity to learn about contemporary European authors' thinking. Indeed, the Literature Night event has become an integral part of the Czech cultural scene. Its target group is not strictly defined; the project is intended for the general public and includes all age and social groups.

It is a non-profit event and admission is free.




Since 2006, the Literature Night project has been organized by **the Czech Centres in cooperation with EUNIC** (Association of National Cultural Institutes of EU Countries), foreign embassies, and the Labyrint publishing house.

The aim of the event is to increase public interest in contemporary European fiction, showing its art forms and creativity. Moreover, it highlights the importance of **multilingualism** and the value of translating from large and small languages.

This year, reading chapters from selected works presented 20 contemporary authors from 18 European countries in Czech translation; Ukrainian literature was included for the second time and Romani literature for the third time.

Since 2013, more and more Czech cities have participated in the project through SKIP, and their number is increasing every year. In addition, in cooperation with the Czech Centres abroad, numerous European and non-European cities participate in the Literature Night. The project is gradually expanding and has become a cultural event with international reach.





The 14th year of the Literature Night was extraordinary from the beginning of the preparations: **the original spring term changed to autumn**, and many more things had to be adapted to the courrent circumstances.

A record number of cities signed up to participate in 2020, not only libraries but also various cultural facilities. However, as a result of government regulations, their number has naturally decreased.

The time gained was used to produce a new website prepared by the IT department of the Czech Centres.

A great benefit was the increased activity on social networks, especially in the form of short video spots, which presented two new books on Facebook every week. The author of the video spots is Františka Bakošová.


Due to travel restrictions, some authors sent **short greetings**, which were posted on social networks or screened as part of the reading.

The Literature Night established **cooperation with the Prague Film Academy of Performing Arts FAMU**, and its
students created records of all readings during the whole
evening, thus capturing the atmosphere of the LN 2020 in
Prague.

Ukraine took part in the Literature Night 2020 for **the second time**.

For **the third time**, **Romani literature** was presented at the Literature Night.

Due to hygienic measures, the number of **seats at individual reading venues was limited**, and visitors consistently used **face masks** and **disinfectant**.

OCTOBER 7th, 2020 PRAGUE 10 – VRŠOVICE & KRÁLOVSKÉ VINOHRADY







During the Literature Night in Prague, literature always comes to life in a different district, which also co-organizes the whole event. This year, it was Prague 10 and its parts Vršovice and Královské Vinohrady. Traditionally, the project was financially supported by the City Hall of Prague.

OPENING

The reason for cooperation with Prague 10 was, among other things, to commemorate the 130th anniversary of the birth of Karel Čapek, who lived in this part of the city. The Literature Night 2020 was also officially opened on October 7th in the premises of the House of the Čapek brothers with the participation of the Prague 10 district's officials, journalists, and other guests. The Literature Night 2020 became the last large-scale public event in Prague before the launch of government anti-epidemic measures and took place in strict compliance with hygiene regulations.



TRADITION & ALTERNATIVE

The Literature Night reading venues are selected, among other things, to highlight the specific nature of the hosting city district. The 2020 event in Vršovice and Královské Vinohrady was called **Tradition** and Alternative, which characterizes the given area well. Just as traditional themes were intertwined with new perspectives in the twenty selected books, in this part of the city, during the Literature Night, traditional venues were mixed, in a unique way, with those to which the fresh content brought new life.

TRADITIONAL & NEW AUDIENCES

Over the years, the Literature Night has earned its traditional and loyal audience; however, the year 2020 saw a large increase in the number of young visitors. This may be attributed to the present situation, but also to the successful selection of reading venues, campaigns on social networks, and young people's growing interest in literature and events happening in Europe.









VOLUNTEERS – ASSISTANTS AT READING VENUES

Due to the difficult situation and distance learning in schools, there were **concerns** about whether a sufficient number **of volunteers** - **assistants** at reading positions - would join the Literature Night. This year their role was more demanding than in previous years; they had an additional job of enforcing **hygienic measures**, inspecting **face masks**, and providing **disinfectant**. This required extraordinary **flexibility, commitment, and independence**. Despite the lower number of participants, the **team of 37 assistants** did an admirable job, and, thanks to their great contribution, the Literature Night 2020 went smoothly and safely.
































FAMU AND A DOCUMENTARY ABOUT LITERATURE NIGHT 2020

ATTENDANCE

Given the current situation, the capacity of the reading venues was limited to 15–30 seats, with regard to social distancing and the number of seats. The number of visitors allowed to stay in individual venues was also affected by changes in selected reading spots; this again occurred in connection with government measures and the overall situation. Nevertheless, the total attendance recorded was almost 3,500 visitors.




Despite the growing popularity of social networks and new media, traditional media - print, television, radio and online news sites - still have a huge reach. Over the years, we have managed to establish relationships with major media houses and further deepen contact with public media.

As part of effectively promoting the project, all available communication channels were used, including **outdoor advertising** (e.g. spots on plasma screens at the Central Station) as well as **accompanying PR activities** (the opening ceremony for representatives of the press and media in Čapek's villa). Effective promotion would not be possible without **the support of key media partners**, **all in the form of unpaid advertising: Czech Television**, **Czech Radio**, Čro **Radiožurnál**, Čro **Vltava**, **TV Praha**, **CNN Prima News**, **ČTK** and many others.

TRANSFER OF MEDIA INTERVENTION BY THE AVE METHOD

AVE helps to find out how media interventions of the monitored PR activities would be reflected in potential profits; that is a conversion of publicity to the price of comparable advertising space in a given medium. (The Czech Centres do not spend any funds on the purchase of paid space; this figure only shows how much they have "saved" through their own publicity or how much they have actually gained – without actually spending these funds). 3 variables are important for the calculation: the first is the size/format of our placed advertisement, the second is the total size of the article, and the last is the advertising price in the given medium. In October 2020, the Literature Night theme dominated the media space in the amount of CZK 5,351,157. Indeed, it is necessary to emphasize that the given financial amount was not actually spent: it is a purely mathematical calculation of the media space value/ related to the LN 2020 topic.




















— The numbers of fans to 20. 12. 2020: 630







NEW LITERATURE NIGHT WEB

In 2020, a **new website** was designed and launched, created by employees of **the IT department of the Czech Centres**. In addition to them, CC interns were in charge of its management. The newly created website proved to be very **functional and user-friendly** and **meets the requirements** for the form and operability of a necessary platform.



Given the nature of the project, creating the website was based on the assumption that visitors would access it mainly from a **computer or mobile phone** as they move from place to place. Figures from 7/10/2020 confirm this estimate as the proportion of user visits by device used is **almost balanced**.

A significant **source of visitor numbers** was also supported by **links to the web on other sites** or **social networks**, which directed **592 users** to the web (in most cases from Facebook, which corresponds to a strong campaign on this social network). **Paid search was not used i**n the project.

WEB VISITORS 7. 10. 2020

On the day of the event (October 7, 2020), a total of **2,201 users** visited the website, of which **1,870 were on the website for the first time**. The website received **2,750 visits** during the day.



In total, visitors viewed 13,938 pages during this day - the most visited page was **Prague**, which had **4,555 views**.

LITERATURE NIGHT MAP

In Prague, the "Literature Night Map" (https://mapa.nocliteratury.cz) works for the project, which offers a plan of reading venues in given streets, together with other information. The site recorded a total of **438** visits.

VII CITIES IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

Due to epidemiological restrictions and government regulations, only **26 cities** organized the 2020 Literature Night event out of **the originally registered 72 cities**. Other cities postponed the event or had to cancel it.





It could take place in Prague thanks to the cooperation and financial support of the Prague 10 District and the City Hall. of the City of Prague, the helpfulness and cooperation of reading venues' operators, the dedicated work of volunteers, the excellent work of the Czech Centres' interns, and, last but not least, the participation of great actors.

In 2020, a new website was designed and launched, created by employees of the Czech Centres' IT department. In addition to them, CC interns were in charge of its management. The newly created website proved to be very functional and user-friendly and meets the requirements for the form and operability of a similar platform.

Although the project was not implemented in all cities of the Czech Republic, the high interest in participating in it is a very positive signal for the coming years.
