INTRODUCTION

Literature Night is a literary project that brings contemporary European literature into unusual and often normally inaccessible places. Excerpts from selected works by contemporary authors, performed by both professional and non-professional readers, connect literary text, unique interpretation, and distinctive venue into an exceptional cultural experience.

Literature Night was founded in 2006 on the initiative of the Czech Centres, in cooperation with EUNIC (European Union National Institutes for Culture), EU diplomatic missions, and the Labyrint publishing house.

The project's aim is to bring contemporary European writers' ideas and works closer to the general public and to offer

a new, inspiring way to experience literature. At the same time, Literature Night draws attention to the **importance of multilingualism** and the **importance of literary translation** – both from major and lesser-spoken European languages.

Over the years, Literature Night has established a firm place in the Czech cultural calendar and has become an inseparable part of it.

The event is **non-profit, and admission to all readings is free**. The project is designed for the widest possible audience – regardless of age or social background.

Since 2013, thanks to cooperation with the Association of Library and Information Professionals (SKIP), other cities across the Czech Republic have joined the project — and their number continues to grow every year. The event also attracts the participation of theatres, cultural centres, and other institutions that help broaden its scope and impact.

Literature Night belongs among the network projects of the Czech Centres and, through cooperation with their foreign branches, it also takes place in many European and non-European cities. Over time, it has become the largest international literary event in the Czechia.

WHAT THE 2025 EDITION BROUGHT

- The subtitle "Book as a Shelter" pointed to the feelings of uncertainty in today's world while emphasizing the need for sharing and openness to new experiences.
- This year's edition presented excerpts from twenty-two new Czech translations of books by twenty-three authors.
- In addition to **twenty EU countries, Ukraine** was again represented, and it has become a tradition to also include Romani literature.
- The guest country of this year's Literature Night was South Korea.
- A record number of more than 90 towns and municipalties signed up to participate in the 2025 edition — not only libraries but also various cultural institutions and organizations.
- The event even reached the women's prison in Světlá nad Sázavou.
- The focus on young audiences continued.

- Elements of **inclusion were** once again incorporated.
- A major contribution came from increased activity on social media, targeted campaigns, and the involvement of the younger generation in creating content.
- The main media partner was once again Czech Radio.
- With the support of the Representation of the European
 Commission in the Czech Republic, Ukrainian literature was included in the programme.

LITERATURE NIGHT IN PRAGUE

SEPTEMBER 17, 2025 PRAGUE 6 - DEJVICE, BUBENEČ, STŘEŠOVICE, HRADČÁNY

During the Literature Night, a different part of Prague comes to life with literature each year, united by a thoughtful selection of reading venues. The history of Prague 6 is closely tied to the events of the 20th century, and the commemoration of the 80th anniversary of the end of World War II, along with the themes of safety, belonging, and the subtitle "The Book as a **Shelter,"** strongly resonated here. Readings took place not only in historically significant buildings but also in diverse locations such as the premises of the Czech Army, university faculties, and community and cultural centres.

INTERPRETATION INTO CZECH SIGN LANGUAGE

This year also saw continued cooperation with organizations for the Deaf. Interpretation was provided by the organization KukátkOO, and the co-organizers were the Institute of Bohemian Studies for Foreigners and Deaf Communication at the Faculty of Arts of Charles University, Pevnost, the Czech Union of the Deaf, and the Association of Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Persons in the Czech Republic.

At five reading venues, two readings were interpreted into **Czech Sign Language** during the evening. A guided route was prepared specifically for Deaf attendees. It is encouraging that, compared to last year, interest in Literature Night among the Deaf has once again increased significantly.

At the same time, at five reading venues, hearing visitors were offered **mini-courses in the basics of Czech Sign Language** during the breaks between readings.





VOLUNTEERS/ASSISTANTS AT READING VENUES

The role of **volunteer assistants** at the reading venues was demanding again this year — partly due to the layout and specific conditions of each location, and also because of the need to organize stations with Czech Sign Language interpreting and to lead mini-courses in Czech Sign Language. The volunteers were responsible for marking and preparing the reading sites, coordinating the arrival and departure of visitors, and in some cases also introducing the readings themselves or cooperating with venue operators and EUNIC colleagues. Their work required great commitment, reliability, and independence.

The team of 48 assistants of various ages did an admirable job, and thanks to their dedication and efforts, Literature Night 2025 ran smoothly and with dignity. Staff members from the Public Diplomacy Department of the Czech Centres also provided supervision at the individual sites.

ATTENDANCE

Although Literature Night has its traditional **audience**, **its composition has changed significantly in recent years**. The 2025 edition also saw **a noticeable increase in young visitors** in the age category up to about 35, thanks in part to a successful **Instagram campaign**. It is positive that the overall makeup of the audience **is not limited to a single generation** and that the project attracts listeners of all age groups.

In 2025, Literature Night again recorded **a record attendance**, with more than **9,500 entries**. According to data from the individual venues, the number of visitors was almost evenly distributed, with the highest attendance exceeding 600 people. Despite this, the **intimate character of the readings was preserved.**

The 2025 campaign used a mix of outdoor advertising, social media, media coverage, and,PR activities.

The literary festival Literature Night has, over the course of 19 years, become a sought-after cultural event not only in Prague but also in other cities and regions across the Czech Republic. The main media partnership with Czech Radio once again had a positive impact.

The main media partner of Literature Night was once again Czech Radio. Editorial coverage by the radio spanned **the entire network, with reach into the regions.**

- A book giveaway contest on Radiožurnál, Vltava, and the Czech Radio intranet.

This year, activity on social media increased again, and the event was successfully supported by two targeted campaigns. The statistics provided cover the period from 1 January 2025 to the end of October 2025.



Literature Night aims to reach **new, younger audiences**, and therefore the Instagram campaign was targeted primarily at them. The posts were created by a student and former intern of the Czech Centres, who recorded short videos introducing the actors who would be reading at Literature Night or who had previous experience with the event. Participants in the videos **invited viewers** to the event itself and also **answered questions** related to this year's theme, **"The Book as a Shelter."**

OUTDOOR ADVERTISING

The outdoor advertising campaign took place in two phases:

- 1. The second half of August on **102 tram-stop panels** managed by the City of Prague;
- 2. The first half of September in various parts of Prague—mainly the city centre and Prague 6—on **tram-stop panels, in the metro throughout the city, and at the train station** (from 3 Sept to 17 Sept 2025).







PRINTED MATERIALS

Visitors have the option to **download the programme brochure** and maps from the Literature Night website. According to surveys, most of them prefer printed versions. The popularity of printed materials is also linked to their attractive graphic design. Brochures and maps were available to visitors free of charge at the reading venues (2,000 brochures and 1,500 maps). This year, visitors could also download the brochure directly on-site via a **QR code** placed at each location. Each reading venue was marked with an **A1-format poster**.



In 2025, more than 90 towns and municipalities across the Czech Republic joined the Literature Night project. It is organized by libraries as well as other cultural institutions and associations. Some cities or venues host Literature Night repeatedly, while others are gradually joining. Local organizers participate mainly on the basis of a call from SKIP (the Association of Library and Information Professionals) or individually. Given the number of participating towns and the popularity of the event, Literature Night has become the most widespread European cultural event in Czechia. One of the new places that joined the project this year was the women's prison in Světlá nad Sázavou.

Information about attendance was provided by 49 towns. Given the overall number of participating towns, total attendance across the Czech Republic (excluding Prague) can be estimated at approximately 12,000 visits. Organizers generally responded positively to their participation in the project, appreciating the cooperation with the project coordinator as well as the overall organization.



Participation in the project requires the reading of contemporary literature and cooperation with EUNIC.




